

Thoughts from the Rectory—December 2024

The Christmas season is fast approaching and many of us have already turned our thoughts to what to buy as a gift for those who are important in our lives.

As some of you may be aware I look out each year for the launching of the Christmas adverts from the major stores with great enthusiasm, to see what their message is (and, of course, to see if there is material for a Christmas sermon or a magazine article!). I was therefore delighted this week as I was just embarking on writing my 'Thoughts from the Rectory' for December that it again



coincided with the release of a number of Christmas adverts. Having reviewed some of them I found to my delight that there were some rich pickings!

John Lewis have again released a Christmas campaign that has a bit of a back story, this year about two sisters and the search for the perfect gift, and as has become customary for Christmas adverts, a 'warm glow' at its heart. The campaign is called 'Give knowingly' and is designed to encourage customers to buy gifts with intention and consideration (all from John Lewis of course!).

According to one of the many and varied reviews on 'Google' the campaign's concept is based on the idea that "knowingly" represents living a life of intention, kindness, and doing the right thing. All very altruistic. One might even forget that the ad is designed to lure you into their store to spend and spend...

But perhaps there is a message in the advert for us to take away again this year. The John Lewis strap line 'give knowingly' might encourage us to think a little more carefully about the gifts we choose and where they come from- as well as who they are destined for.

Perhaps we could consider this year giving with greater respect and care for the environment – choosing gifts that are ethically sourced and produced, are eco-friendly or fairly traded; using wrappings made from recycled paper and those that are plastic-free. Perhaps you might look at giving a charitable gift, such as those available through Oxfam (and many other charities) to help transform the lives of those in poverty rather than buying something at all.

Whatever you decide to give, and wherever you decide to purchase your gifts, I hope you will keep in mind that the reason you are giving at all is because it is **Christ**mas. We celebrate Christmas because in the beginning God gave knowingly from his love – a world of diversity, colour and beauty, and into that world he gave knowingly his son Jesus.

'For a child is born to us, a son is given to us.

And he will be called:

Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God,

Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

He will rule with fairness and justice for all eternity.

taken from Isaiah 9:6-7

This gift from God is the best gift that we could possibly receive – given knowingly – because God knows that we need the saving presence of Jesus in our lives.

I pray that this Christmas as you ponder on the gifts you might give, that you will seek out the gift of Jesus that is given again knowingly by God every year at Christmas (and every day in between) and that you might find that Jesus is the only gift you really need.

News from the Parish of Car Colston and Screveton

November is the month for

Remembrance. St Mary's had the privilege of



hosting the Fosse Group service to mark All Souls Day remembering those we have loved and lost. The congregation from across the Fosse Group joined together for this quiet, reflective and personal service. Rev Ruth led the prayers in memory of loved ones and there was an

opportunity to light candles and add names to the Prayer Tree.

Whereas All Souls related to personal loss the following week Armistice Day provided a time for national remembrance. St Mary's churchyard was the setting for the annual village Act of Remembrance. In the presence of 23 villagers the names of the fallen from Car Colston were read aloud. In addition to the traditional British Legion wording considerable thought was given to accompanying prose and poetry. Both are well worth a read. The Proud Tower by Barbara W. Tuchman paints a portrait of the world before the Great War (chapter 2 'The Idea and the Deed'). In contrast 'Have you Forgotten Yvonne' is a deeply touching poem found unsigned in the papers of Lieutenant Colonel V. O. Robinson M.C. of Chesterfield who at one time served in the 6th Battalion Sherwood Foresters. The poem is believed to date from the First World War.



Rev Ruth led the delightful service complete with Bible reading and prayers, jelly babies and bubbles. The refreshed Children's Area was moved to a position at the heart of the congregation where it proved to be a big success with all the young families attending.

The concluding service of the month focused on Safeguarding in the Church of England. It was a timely reminder of the responsibility we all have for safeguarding with a reflection from Rev Ruth on

the traumatic events set out in the Makin Report and an overview of parish safeguarding from the Parish Safeguarding Officer.

A Wine Tasting Evening was held at **St Mary's** on Thursday

14th November to raise funds for both parish churches. We were



an engaging talk about each of the 10 tasting wines. There were a few nervous moments when transferring red wine between glasses to replicate decanting but thankfully carpet

Sustainable Fashion Forget 'Fast' Fashion

A Rocha have some advice on sustainable fashion. It tells us that the fashion industry is the second most polluting in the world after the oil industry. Questions are being asked about the environmental ethics of raw materials, factory working conditions and the limited life of many articles of clothing. Less well publicised issues of the industry are the CO2 emissions and water use. (The UN tells us that the manufacture of one pair of jeans uses 10,000 litres of water.)

Recycling clothes can help with reducing the environmental impact your wardrobe is having. Giving to and buying from charity shops or by using one of the growing number of online sites where you can buy and sell 'pre-loved' clothes, are ways of using less resources.

If you are buying new, look for brands that are promoting sustainable fashion. Tearfund suggests some here, a five minute read.

News from St Helen's church

St Helen's Remembrance Service was held on 10 November to honour those who were lost in the wars both past and recent. Kneeton lost two men in WWI - one, aged 22, was in the Royal Field Artillery and is buried in Sailly-Saillisel British Cemetery; the other, aged 33 was in the Royal Army Veterinary Corps.

The Army Veterinary Service began in 1796, but became the Royal Army Veterinary Corps in 1918. This was in recognition of the amazing work carried out by them. In WW1 about 450,000 horses were continually in service on the Western Front. There are records of 2.5 million casualty admissions to field veterinary hospitals of which 2 million returned to duty! The Corps is now responsible for 1,400 dogs deployed all round the world, as guard dogs or in mine detection in strategic locations.
