My husband Mark and I decided that we would venture out on the recent May Bank Holiday Monday to a stately home, something we have always enjoyed doing. The weather was warm and sunny, the perfect day to explore a house, walk in wonderful gardens and have a leisurely lunch out.

We decided to go to Burghley House on the edge of Stamford and took some time (after our delightful lunch in the Orangery Restaurant) to wander through the house and take in some of the treasures and art works



that had been collected by the Earls of Exeter down through the generations from the time of William Cecil (Lord High Treasurer to Queen Elizabeth I).

Our visit continued into the vast gardens where a Sculpture Exhibition caught our eye. We eagerly entered the gardens and were told that through the wonders of technology the QR code in the leaflet would give us a guide so we could find our way around. All well and good, except that the QR code failed to deliver!
